REGULAR MEETING

June 7, 2011

This Regularly scheduled meeting of the Governing Body of the City of Lake Park was

called to order on June 7, 2011, 7:30 pm by Mayor Sandlin who led in flag salute and

prayer. Those present, Mayor Sandlin, members Carter, Mulkey, Schindler, City Attorney

City clerk and interested citizens.

Member Schindler moved to waive the reading of the Public Hearing minutes of May 3,

2011 and Regular meeting, May 3, 2011, and adopt as presented. Motion second by

member Mulkey, all approved. Financial Statements reviewed and accepted as

presented.

No Citizens Concerns were presented.

Mr. Nick Valenti, auditor approached Council for the initial communication concerning

City's 2010 audit (see attached). Completed audit will be presented July 5, 2011.

Ms. Penny Perrin, representing the Lake Park Chamber of Commerce gave members

an update on Independence festivities, to be held at Tom's Pond, July 2nd, 2011, 2:00

pm until fireworks at dark.

City had received a bid from Mike Powers to restore electrical service at the old jail

(\$975.00 see attached), member Schindler moved City accept, motion second by

member Mulkey, all approved.

Mayor presented bill from Scruggs Concrete for re-surfacing a portion of Long Pond Rd.

(35,282.04). Member Schindler moved City pay bill, using any funds remaining in SPLOST

V, and balance from SPLOST VI. Motion second by member Carter, all approved.

Temporary maintenance placement was discussed, with member Schindler moving to

employ Billy Jones at \$9.00 per hour, as a full time employee. Motion second by member Carter, all approved.

No action taken on agenda item, West St.

Member Schindler explained that people are parking on the sidewalk along

Broadway St. Police were directed to make sure no one is parking on sidewalk.

Under upgrading street/traffic signs, City Attorney advised Council the City needed to

conduct a reflectivity test on all signs and begin having a replacement plan adopted

before January 2012.

Resolution # 2011-06-07 regarding approval of amendment to the Greater Lowndes

Solid Waste Management plan was discussed, with members wanting more information

on amendment changes before signing.

Member Schindler drew for the June e-mail contest, this month's winner of an oil service/inspection by Busick's Automotive was won by Stephen Scanlon. He (Schindler)

mentioned the three qualifiers for Special Election: Cathi Brown, Patricia Brown and

Sandy Sherrill. Police Chief Rutland approached Council on replacing computers, and

other necessary equipment for his department. The safety of our officers being the main concern, member Schindler move City purchase from SPLOST VI funds the attached list of equipment. (see attached, \$25,173.98), motion second by member

Carter, all approved.

Member Schindler moved Council go into Executive Session, motion second by member Mulkey, all approved. Meeting called back to order at 8:50 pm by Mayor

Sandlin, with member Schindler moving Mayor sign affidavit and resolution as to matter of Executive Session, second by member Carter, all approved. Mayor Sandlin

presented a bid for repairs/construction in the maintenance compound, members

wanted more than one bid, clerk was instructed to advertise for bids. Member

Schindler moved City expend up to \$1,000.00 for pre-costs of Independence festivities,

and \$3,000.00 on fireworks display. Motion second by member Mulkey, all approved.

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned at 9:05 pm.
